





## PLEDGE AND SPEECH ACTIVITY: NASHA MUKT BHARAT ABHIYAN

## 3D FLOWER MAKING COMPETITION




**Digital Tools:** Informed about the Voter Helpline App (VHA), BLO App, and the ECINet Digital Platform for efficient voter roll management.
